For children born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018



Applying for a nursery place – summary

Your child would be eligible for a funded nursery place from the term following their third birthday.

If your child was born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018 and you wish to apply for a nursery place for September 2021, you must complete an online application by 16 February 2021 through the E-admissions website: **www.eadmissions.org.uk**.

If you would like a nursery place at a voluntary aided school, free school or academy, you must – as well as completing an online application – complete the school's Supplementary Information Form (SIF), if they have one.

From 11 June 2021, Pupil Services will identify nursery places for any children that are unplaced and those that applied late.

Your Child Starts Nursery If your application was received on or before the closing date (16 February 2021), Pupil Services will notify you of the outcome of your application by letter and email. The letter will be sent on **7 May 2021** and will name the nursery at which a place has been offered for your child. The email will be sent after 5pm on the same day. **This offer will be for a part-time place only**.



If you have not been offered a place at your chosen nurseries, you will be sent a list of nurseries that still have places remaining and given the opportunity to visit and apply to one of these nurseries. Your child will also be placed on the waiting list for your preferred nursery.

You must accept or decline the offer of a place by 21 May 2021.

If you do not reply by 21 May 2021, the offer will be withdrawn.

Once your child has been offered a part-time place, you may request a full-time place from your nursery.

From September 2020, parents wishing to make an in-year transfer application, or parents who wish to make an application who have not yet done so, must make an application direct to the Local Authority using the 'In-Year Nursery Admission 2020/21' application form which will be available to download from the Tower Hamlets website or available from Pupil Services.

If your child turns three during the 2020/21 school year, you may apply for a nursery place for the term following their third birthday.

More than 97% of Tower Hamlets maintained nursery and primary schools have now been judged 'Good' or 'Outstanding' by Ofsted and the borough has some of the fastest improving schools in the country. The latest nursery and primary school results show that very high standards are common in schools across the borough. This has meant a rise in the number of parents wanting to send their children to our schools and in turn there is a greater demand for school places in the borough.

Most schools in Tower Hamlets receive more applications than there are places available, so some children may not be offered a place at the preferred school(s). Please be aware of this when deciding which schools to apply to in order of preference. We're proud that Tower Hamlets schools are inclusive and that children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities are educated well and thriving in our mainstream settings.

I am sure you have very high aspirations for your child and expect high levels of achievement as well as good behaviour and regular attendance.

Together we can ensure your child and all children in Tower Hamlets progress well and make the best of their time at school. 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Introduction

This booklet is for parents with a child born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018 who wish to apply for a place in a nursery school or a nursery class attached to a primary school in Tower Hamlets for September 2021.

Children will usually start nursery in the September following their third birthday. It is possible for eligible children to access a funded nursery place from the beginning of the term after their third birthday. Both part-time (15 hours per week) and full-time (30 hours per week) places are available at Tower Hamlets nurseries.

Who is nursery education for?

Nursery Education is free for all three to four-year-olds. Your child is entitled to 15 hours free early years education per week and this is available from the term after their 3rd birthday. Eligible parents may also be entitled to an additional 15 hours per week. Some parents of two-year olds are also eligible for 15 hours free nursery but must meet certain government (income-based) criteria.

The benefits of choosing nursery education

Attending a nursery school or a nursery class gives children a valuable introduction to school. They will have the opportunity to develop their skills and to be part of a large group of children of their own age. We work in partnership with parents to give your child the best possible start to their education and prepare them for reception class.

Our nurseries are run by experienced, early years trained teachers and supported by nursery nurses and early years trained teaching assistants. All nursery education in Tower Hamlets nursery schools and nursery classes in primary schools are rated good by Ofsted and many are rated outstanding.

The nursery day is arranged to allow each child to develop at their own pace. Nursery classes are usually organised in the same way as a school, with three terms. A typical day in nursery consists of two sessions: a morning session from approximately 9am to 12pm and an afternoon session from approximately

12:30pm to 3:30pm. Some settings offer wrap-around-care which means children can attend breakfast club (e.g. from 8am) and after school care (e.g. until 5:30pm).

Nurseries welcome visits from parents as we want you to feel confident that you pick the right setting for your child. It is well worth visiting a few nursery settings before making your application.

Other pre-school provisions

Private, voluntary and independent nurseries, preschools and play groups also offer pre-school provision. A list of these providers is available from the Family Information Service on **020 7364 6495**.

Nursery class sessions

Nursery classes are part-time for 15 hours or full-time for 30 hours each week during school term.

Usually children attend either a morning or afternoon session of three hours, or a full day. Where a school offers both morning and afternoon sessions, the school will allocate the sessions. Sessions may be allocated in consultation with parents. No guarantee is made of the session time when a place is offered. Children from multiple births will be offered the same session



Part-time and full-time funding

All parents are entitled to 15 hours per week of free early years education for 38 weeks each year from the start of the school term after their child's third birthday until the child reaches compulsory school age i.e. the term after their fifth birthday.

An additional free 15 hours will only be available for families where both parents are working (or the sole parent is working).

Typically, each parent must earn the equivalent of 16 hours a week at the national minimum or living wage and less than £100,000 a year to be eligible.

Only part-time places will be offered as part of this coordinated scheme. Once your child has been offered a part-time place, you may request a full-time place from your nursery. Full-time places will be subject to availability and will depend on the eligibility criteria outlined in the previous paragraph.

Parents not eligible for the additional free 15 hours may still access a full time place by paying a top-up fee. This fee will be set by each nursery. Please contact your local nursery for further information.

Early learning for two-year olds

Some children may be eligible for 15 hours of funded childcare from the term after their second birthday. Unlike the nursery education for three and four year olds which is open to all, the early learning for two- year-olds is only available to children and families that meet certain criteria.

Children love to play and learn, and Tower Hamlets has some excellent nurseries, pre-school playgroups and childminders where they can do just that.

Your child could take up their place in the term after they turn two, with 15 hours a week of free care, if you are on a low income, if your child has additional needs or if your child is looked after by the council. If you have an older child at school and they receive free school meals, your younger children will probably be eligible for a free two-year-old place too.

Your child will be eligible if any of the following apply:

- they have a current Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- they get Disability Living Allowance
- they have left care through special guardianship or an adoption or child arrangement order
- they are looked after by the local authority

Families who have no recourse to public funds are not eligible for a funded Early Learning for Two Year Olds.

Alternatively, you can go to your nearest children's centre, and they will be able to do the check. For more information on children's centres please see page 26.

You can also call the Family Information Service on **020 7364 6495** to check your eligibility. The Family Information Service will also be able to discuss with you what childcare is available and what best suits you and your child.

Applying for a nursery place

Start dates

Children will usually start nursery school or a nursery class in the September following their third birthday. However, it is possible for eligible children to access a funded place from the beginning of the term after their third birthday.

How to apply

If your child was born between 1
September 2017 and 31 August 2018

online application by 16 February 2021.

When you have completed and submitted your application you will receive an instant email confirmation. You can then make changes to your application up until the 16 February 2021 closing date.

If you are not able to make an online application, you should contact Pupil Services on 020 7364 5006.

If you wish to apply to a private nursery or a nursery in another local borough, you must contact the nursery directly.

To find out how to apply for a nursery place for other than a September start i.e. January or April, please refer to page 12. Alternatively, you can contact Pupil Services on 020 7364 5006 or email school.admissions@towerhamlets.gov.uk.

Completing an application

Parents must complete and submit an online application via the E-admissions website: **www.eadmissions.org.uk**. You can apply for up to three Tower Hamlets nurseries.

If you would like a nursery place at a voluntary aided school, free school or academy, you must, – as well as completing an online application, – complete the school's Supplementary Information Form (SIF) if they have one.

Applications must be made by the child's parent or the person with parental responsibility. If you are not the parent of the child on the application form, you must include evidence of parental responsibility i.e. a Court Order, a solicitor's letter, or a letter from the parent named on the child's birth certificate giving you permission to care for their child. If you are not a blood relative you must register with the local authority as a private foster carer. The pupil services team will refer applications to the local authority's social care team if it has concerns about whom a child is living with.

When submitting your online application, you are confirming the information you have given is accurate and complete, and that you understand if it is not, the local authority has the right to withhold or withdraw the offer of a place.

Closing date

The closing date for applications is **Tuesday 16 February 2021**.

All applications made during the application period are treated in the same way in accordance with the procedure described in the following sections.

Applications are not processed on a first come first served basis.

It is very important not to apply late, because applications made after the closing date will be considered only after places have been allocated to children whose parents applied on time.

Nursery class places are in considerable demand and most schools will not have vacancies once all applications that have been received on time have been processed.

Applying for a nursery place

How decisions are made

The pupil services team will process applications and coordinate the decisions for all those who apply.

Your application for each school is processed individually and, in each case, a decision is taken to determine whether or not your child can be offered a place.

If we find that we can place your child at more than one of your school preferences only one school will be allocated. This will be for the highest preference school at which an offer can be made.

The decisions on applications for Tower Hamlets community nurseries are made by the local authority. If a Tower Hamlets community nursery receives more applications than places available, the decision on whether or not a place can be offered will be made in accordance with the local authority's admission criteria set out in priority order as follows:

- Children looked after by the local authority including adopted children who were previously looked after and children who leave care under a special guardianship or residence order;
- Children for whom it is deemed there is strong educational, medical or social reason to attend the school applied to (see note 1);
- 3. Children living within the catchment area who have a sibling attending the school (including the school of separate infant and junior schools) and who will continue to do so on the date of admission (see note 2);
- 4. Children whose parent is a member of staff who has been employed at the school concerned for two or more years at the time of application and/ or children of a member of staff who has been recruited to fill a vacancy for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage;
- 5. Children who live within the catchment area of the school and for whom the school applied for is their nearest community school within the catchment area:
- Other children from within the catchment area of the school:
- 7. Children living outside of the catchment area with a sibling at the school;

8. Children living outside of the catchment area of the school applied to.

Tie-break

In the event of oversubscription within categories 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 above, priority will be given to children who live closest to the school by the shortest walking distance. A digitised ordnance survey map is used to measure the distance from the home address to the school's designated official entrance. In the event of two distances being the same, a decision will be made by random allocation.

Notes

Note 1: This can include the parents', carers' or other family members' medical conditions and the family's social needs. Parents must complete the relevant section on the application form and attach medical and/or social reports from a suitable professional (e.g. a doctor or social worker) to support the application.

Note 2: Sibling means a whole, half or step-brother or step-sister resident at the same address.

Admission arrangements for voluntary aided schools, academies and free schools

For voluntary aided schools, free schools and academies, it is the school's governors who will make decisions, based on the information you provided in your application and the school's Supplementary Information Form (SIF). Admission policies and oversubscription criteria for these schools can be found on their websites or at www.towerhamlets.gov.uk/schooladmissions.

The Paradigm Academies (Culloden, Old Ford and Solebay), St Paul's Way Foundation Trust School, The LETTA Trust Primary Schools (Bygrove Primary School and Stebon Primary School) and The Clara Grant Primary School (part of The Tower Trust) have delegated decisions on admissions to the local authority and, therefore, use the same oversubscription criteria as Tower Hamlets community schools.

Notification of decisions

If your application was received on or before the closing date (16 February 2021), Pupil services will notify you of the outcome of your application by letter and email. The letter will be sent on 7 May 2021 and will name the nursery at which a place has been offered for your child. The email will be sent after 5pm on the same day. This offer will be for a part-time place only.

If you have not been offered a place at your chosen nurseries, you will be sent a list of nurseries that still have places remaining and given the opportunity to visit and apply to one of these nurseries. Your child will also be placed on the waiting list for your preferred nursery.

You must accept or decline the offer of a place by 21 May 2021 so that nursery places can then be re-allocated. If you do not reply by 21 May 2021, the offer will be withdrawn.

Appeals

As nursery is non-statutory, parents do not have the right of appeal if they do not get their preferred nursery choice. However, parents may contact the Local authority for more information on the reason as to why their child was not offered a place.

Waiting lists

All children will automatically be added to the waiting lists of higher preference nurseries than the one offered, unless parents ask to remove their child from a waiting list.

Waiting lists for Tower Hamlets community nurseries will be kept and maintained by pupil services in the order of priorities set out on page 10.

Waiting lists for Own Admission Authority nurseries i.e. voluntary aided schools, academies and free schools will be kept and maintained by the nursery itself.

Applying for a nursery place

Post offer process

After 7 May 2021, unsuccessful applicants will automatically be added to the waiting list for their preferred nursery. At this stage consideration will be given to late applicants (i.e. those that applied after 16 February 2021) alongside those that were unsuccessful in the initial round of offers.

From 11 June 2021, pupil services will identify nursery places for any children that are unplaced and those that applied late.

From September 2021, parents wishing to make an in-year transfer application, or parents who wish to make an application who have not yet done so, must make an application direct to the local authority using the 'In-Year Nursery Admission 2021/22' application form which will be available to download from the Tower Hamlets website and available from pupil services.

Once children are in nursery, transfers to other nurseries (in-year transfers) will only take place at the start of each term (January and April), unless there are exceptional circumstances for a transfer to be considered earlier.

If your child turns three during the 2021/22 school year, you may apply for a nursery place for the term following their third birthday.

Children with additional needs

If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) then you must contact the local authority's Special Educational Needs (SEN) team to access a nursery place. You can contact the SEN team on 020 7364 4880.

If you child has additional/special educational needs or a disability but does not have an EHCP, you should apply for a nursery place through the usual route. You may also contact your local Children's Centre for advice on getting additional support.

Nursery readiness

It is expected that you will have trained your child to be toilet trained before they start in a nursery class. They should also be able to initiate requests and have to and fro conversations with others.

Applying for a nursery place in 2020/21

If your child was born between
1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017
and does not attend nursery, you can
apply for a nursery place for the 2020/21
school year by making an application
direct to the local authority using the
'In-Year Nursery Admission 2020/21'
application form which is available to
download from the Tower Hamlets
website and available from Pupil Services.

Pupil Services will normally let parents know whether or not a place can be offered within ten school days of receiving an application for a child who does not have a nursery place.

If your child turns three during the 2020/21 school year, you may apply for a nursery place for the term following their third birthday i.e. January 2021 or April 2021.

Transferring from one nursery to another (in-year nursery transfer)

You may want your child to transfer from one Tower Hamlets nursery to another. This can be arranged by pupil services, but you will first need to speak with the head teacher of your child's current nursery and complete the 'In-Year Nursery Admission 2020/21' application form which is available to download from the Tower Hamlets website and available from pupil services.

Once children are in nursery, transfers to other nurseries (in-year transfers) will only take place at the start of each term (i.e. January and April), unless there are exceptional circumstances for a transfer to be considered earlier.

It is not always possible for a child to transfer to another school if that school is already full or if there are more applicants than places available at the time you make your application. Your child will, therefore, be placed on the school's waiting list in line with the school's admission criteria.

The local authority will consider transfer requests in line with the timetable below:

Admission to primary school

Whether or not your child is accepted for a nursery class place, you will need to apply separately for a place in the reception class of a primary school.

There is no automatic right of transfer from the nursery class to the reception class in the same school, and attending a nursery class does not give any priority for admission to reception class at the same school.

You can apply for a reception place at a different primary school to one where your child attends the nursery.

Children eligible for nursery in 2021/22 would normally start primary school in September 2022.

The application period for admission to reception class in 2022 will be from 1 September 2021 to 15 January 2022. A booklet with information about applying for a reception place will be available online at www.towerhamlets. gov.uk/schooladmissions from 1 September 2021.


Applying for a nursery place

Data protection

The information you provide on your application will be held by the London Borough of Tower Hamlets in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Your information may be shared with relevant council departments, schools or other local education authorities for the purposes of admissions or fulfilling a statutory duty. We will pass the information to the school your child is offered a place at, where it will form part of the pupil database that the school keeps. Your information will be kept by the local authority for eight years after an offer of a place is made. You may withdraw your consent for the processing of your information, which will also mean the withdrawal of the nursery place that is offered, at any time by contacting the pupil services team within the local authority. You also have a right to complain, object to or access the information that is held and processed about you. Please see the council's website (www.towerhamlets.gov.uk) for further details on contacting the Complaints and Information team.







Children's centres

A Children's centre, often called a Sure Start Children's Centre, is a place where parents, carers or families with children under the age of five can go and use play facilities, join in groups and receive support.

The purpose of children's centres is to improve outcomes for young children and their families by shaping:

- child development and school readiness
- parenting aspirations and parenting skills
- child and family health and life chances.

Children's centres work with parents, families, settings and the community from as early as possible to make sure children are ready for school. The centres offer a range of support to parents including dedicated school readiness workshops which include potty training and managing behaviour.

The vision of the Integrated Early Years' Service is for every child in Tower Hamlets to have the best possible start in life - through reducing inequalities and improving quality of life. Children's centre services aims to support children and their families to be safe and happy - improving lifelong health and wellbeing.



Frequently asked questions about nursery admission

When can my child start nursery?

Children can start nursery from the term following their third birthday.

If your child was born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018 and you would like a nursery place for September 2021, you must submit an online application by 16 February 2021.

For guidance on how to make an application, please see page 36.

What if I want a nursery place before September 2021?

If you would like a nursery place for your child for the term following their third birthday but before September 2021 i.e. in January or April 2021, please refer to page 12 for advice on how to make an in-year nursery application, or contact Pupil Services.

What if my child turns three during the 2020/21 school year?

If your child turns three during the 2020/21 school year, you may apply for a nursery place for the term following their third birthday by making an in-year application. For information on how to do that, please refer to page 12. Alternatively, you can contact Pupil Services.

How can I make sure my child settles into nursery quickly?

Important independence skills such as using the toilet independently, putting on their coat, eating using cutlery, washing their hands, sharing with others, initiating conversation with peers and adults will help a child to settle into nursery quickly. It would also be helpful if children were used to spending time away from their parents.

What if I am not a Tower Hamlets resident but would like a place at a Tower Hamlets nursery?

If you are not a resident of Tower Hamlets but wish to apply for a Tower Hamlets nursery, you can also submit an online application via the E-admissions website: www.eadmissions.org.uk.

Frequently asked questions about nursery admission

Is there financial help available for nursery provision?

All children aged three and four are entitled to 15 hours a week of free nursery education during school term times (38 weeks a year) from the term following their third birthday. This entitlement can also be taken in a private or voluntary provision.

Only where both parents are working a minimum of 16 hours (or a single parent working a minimum of 16 hours in a single parent family) will a child be eligible for a free full-time place (30 hours a week).

If you are not eligible for a full-time place and you would like for your child to attend for longer hours you will be asked to pay for the additional services.

Some two-year-olds may also be eligible for 15 hours funding for 38 weeks, but must meet certain government (incomebased) criteria. You can check your eligibility by visiting www.myearlylearning.co.uk/EarlyYears/About or by calling the Family Information Service on 020 7364 6495.

For information on private or voluntary nurseries or playgroups, you can contact them directly or you can contact the Family Information Service on **020 7364 6495**.

Will my child be offered a full-time place?

The local authority will only offer parttime places i.e. for 15 hours per week. Once your child has been offered a parttime place, you may request a full-time place from your nursery.

An additional free 15 hours i.e. a full time place will only be available for families where both parents are working (or the sole parent is working).

Typically, each parent must earn the equivalent of 16 hours a week at the national minimum or living wage and less than £100,000 a year to be eligible.

Parents not eligible for the additional free 15 hours may still access a full time place by paying a top-up fee. This fee will be in the region of £7.50 per additional hour. Please contact your local nursery for further information.

Can my child attend more than one provision?

It is not recommended for a child to be attending more than one type of underfives activity (e.g. playgroup in the morning and nursery class in the afternoon). The adjustment is too demanding and confusing for most children of this age and much of the benefit from either activity could be lost.

Can I transfer my child between nurseries?

Once children are admitted to nursery education, it is in their interests to remain at that school until they have to move on and start reception class. Children take at least a term to settle and can find it very upsetting to move at this stage.

Transfers will only take place at the start of each term and should only be considered if a family has moved from the area or on exceptional grounds. Please refer to page 13 for more information.

Frequently asked questions about nursery admission

When can my child move from a nursery to primary school?

Children usually start the reception year of primary school in the September following their fourth birthday. If your child was born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018 they will start Rreception in September 2022. Children who attend a school's nursery class **do not** automatically transfer to reception, as decisions on primary school admissions are taken separately. You must apply for a reception place by 15 January 2022.

If my child is already in the school's nursery class, is there an automatic right to a place in the reception class?

No. When parents apply for their children to start reception, no priority is given to children that attend the nursery of the school. The decision on whether or not a place can be offered will be made in accordance with the school's admission policy. The policy used for community schools in Tower Hamlets is explained on page 10.

If my child is not offered a nursery place can I appeal the decision?

Parents do not have the right of appeal against the decision to refuse their child a nursery place. However, parents may contact the local authority for more information on the reason why their child was not offered a place.

Can I get help with free early education or childcare for my two-year-old?

Your two-year-old child may be entitled to 15 hours education or childcare a week if you are in receipt of low income welfare benefit or your child meets other criteria. Your child would be eligible from the beginning of the term after their second birthday if you qualify for a funded place. For more information, please call the Family Information Service on **020 7364 6495**.

Primary place review for parents

Our changing borough: the effect on primary school places

Tower Hamlets is currently undertaking a Primary Place Review.

The numbers of children in the borough have changed significantly and there are now fewer children in the west of the borough, whilst there is still some growth in child numbers in other parts. This admissions booklet identifies which schools will be involved in consultations to address these demographic changes and which may be subject to alterations in the number of places available for September 2021. It is therefore really important that parents apply for more than one school to ensure a place at one of their schools of preference.

The council is working with schools to reduce the number of unused school places in parts of the borough. This will ensure that our schools continue to provide the highest standards of teaching, learning and achievement.

Why is the council reviewing primary school places?

There have been lots of changes to the borough's population in recent years. The number of children being born in the borough is reducing and more families are moving out of the borough before their children reach primary school age. This has led to a number of unused places at primary schools across the borough, with schools in some areas finding that they have more unused places than they would normally expect.

The funding that schools receive from central government is based on the number of children they have registered. Therefore, when a school's number of children is lower than expected it receives less funding and this can mean that the school finds it difficult to retain and or recruit enough teachers and support staff to maintain high standards of teaching and learning.

The council has the responsibility to make sure that its school places are organised in a way that helps all schools to continue to maintain high standards.

What does this actually mean for schools?

We are considering ways in which schools can build on existing relationships. One approach is by a group of nearby schools establishing a formal partnership. This will enable them to reduce the number of unused places in their area by organising themselves in a way that will help them to make the best use of their funding and other expertise. This type of partnership is called a school federation with a single governing body responsible for the governance of all schools in the federation.

Another approach is for two or more schools to join together to create a new school on one site. This would also reduce the number of unused places and allow the new school to have enough registered children to receive the levels of funding that would ensure there were no teaching or other staff shortages. This is called a school amalgamation.

The approach will depend on the local area and the schools involved

For a school where the numbers of children are very low and it is not possible for it to join a federation or be part of an amalgamation with a neighbouring school then the council will need to consider whether the school should close. However, the council will only consider this if it is in the best educational interests of the pupils concerned as keeping the school open would inevitably lead to a fall in teaching standards.

The council would ensure that these children could transfer to other nearby schools and that, where possible, staff would have the option to be redeployed within the borough.

What schools will be affected?

The review is focused on schools with high levels of unused places in the west of the borough - in the Bethnal Green, Stepney and Wapping areas.

When proposals are decided they will be for changes to take place from September 2021 at the earliest.

Who will be involved in the decision making process?

There will be no decisions on changes to how schools are organised without first consulting with school communities and the wider public on the proposals. There will be an initial round of consultation for the schools concerned later this term and a further boroughwide consultation in the autumn (timing may vary for individual schools).

These consultations will include events where pupils, parents, staff and the community are able to share their views, ask questions and raise any concerns they may have.

Appendix A – Understanding school catchment areas and the oversubscription criteria

Understanding school catchment areas and the oversubscription criteria

Tower Hamlets Council seeks to operate an admissions system that provides equal and fair opportunities to all applicants. This includes having due regard to children living in areas where there are limited options in applying for a local school place.

School catchment area

A school catchment area is a geographically defined boundary used to help provide children with fairer access to a local school and ensure all schools in an area have an equal share of children.

A child living in the school's catchment area will, therefore, be given priority over a child living outside of the school's catchment area. This does not affect admission categories where children with a statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) are considered before any other admission. Catchment areas also do not affect looked-after children who

are given first priority in the admission policy. Other exceptional cases, such as medical and social reasons, will also be given priority before children living in the catchment area.

There are six school catchment areas for admission to Tower Hamlets community schools. The Paradigm Academies (Culloden, Old Ford and Solebay), St Paul's Way Trust Primary School, Bygrove Primary School, Stebon Primary School and The Clara Grant Primary School also use these catchment areas in their admissions criteria. Each catchment area has a number of schools that you can choose from. Maps of each catchment area and the schools within them can be found on pages 15-21.

Nearest school within the catchment area

Higher priority is given to children who apply to the nearest school within their catchment area.

This reduces the possibility of a family having to undertake an unreasonable journey to school and provides equal opportunity for families living in parts of the borough where there are a limited number of schools. Please see the examples on the next page which show how this works in practice.

Tie-break criteria

When there are more children within one of the admission priorities than there are places remaining at the school, the council must decide who to offer places to. The tie-break gives priority to children that live the shortest walking distance from the school. For example, a school may have 25 places remaining once all children for whom the school is the nearest school in the catchment area, but there are 30 other children who have applied and live within the same catchment area. The 25 children that live closest to the school will be offered a place and the five children that live furthest from the school will not be offered a place.

Appendix A – Understanding school catchment areas and the oversubscription criteria

Example 1



In this tie-break example, Child A, Child B, Child C and Child D have all applied to Green School.

Green School is the nearest school for Child A, Child B and Child C. The nearest school for Child D is Blue School.


Given that Green School is Child A, Child B and Child C's nearest school, their applications will have higher priority than Child D's.

The highest priority would be given to Child B who lives 250m away from Green School, followed by Child C, who lives 400m away and then Child A, who lives 800m away. These children would, therefore, be ranked in order of priority as follows:

Admissions criteria	Ranking order
Priority 4 – nearest school in catchment area	1. Child B 2. Child C 3. Child A
Priority 5 – catchment area	4. Child D

Note: Although Child D lives closer to Green School than Child A, Child A will have higher priority because Green School is Child A's nearest school.

Example 2



This example is similar to the first one, but here Child B has decided not to apply to Green School, which is Child B's nearest school.

Even though Child B lives closer to Green School than the other children, Child B would not be considered for a place at Green School, because no application was made. The ranking in order of priority would therefore be as follows:

Admissions criteria	Ranking order
Priority 4 – nearest school in catchment area	1. Child C 2. Child A
Priority 5 – catchment area	3. Child D

Note: Child B's applications to Blue and White School would not be considered under the nearest school criterion because neither of these schools are Child B's nearest school.

Registration

Go to www.eadmissions.org.uk

This will take you to the welcome page – click on 'Create a new account' – see figure 1.

You will need to validate your email address by clicking on the link in the email that is sent to you.







Figure 2 Figure 3

From here you can make a new application, edit an existing application, view the details of any application already submitted and view the outcome of your application once it is available.

Click on 'Start Application' to begin.

Stage 1 - Child details

Fill in your child's details and then click 'Save and continue' see figure 5.





Appendix B - A step by step guide to applying online

Stage 2 - School preferences

Here you can apply for up to six schools, in Tower Hamlets and/or other boroughs. You should select the schools in order of preference, with the first selected school being your first preference and so on.

You can add a school in one of three ways:

- **1.** By selecting the borough of the school using the dropdown list and then selecting the school.
- 2. By selecting your school from its location on a map.
- **3.** By searching for the school by using keywords.

Click on 'Continue' – see figure 7.

For each school selected you will be asked to provide the following information:

- 1. Sibling information you should click on the relevant box and fill in the details if your child has a brother or sister already at the school.
- 2. Exceptional medical or social reasons you should tick the relevant box if there are medical or social reasons for your child to attend a particular school. You will be required to provide documentary evidence to support this.
- **3.** Additional reasons this is for you to give additional reasons for wanting a particular school.





Appendix B – A step by step guide to applying online

Stage 3 - Check and submit

When you have entered all the required information, you will be prompted to check that the information is accurate and then asked to submit application – see figure 8.

Even if you submit it straight away, you can still make changes later, right up until the closing date.

Confirmation

Once you have submitted an application, you will see the confirmation page, with a reference number. Please keep your reference number for any enquiries. You will also be sent an email to confirm that your application has been submitted.

It is advisable to print a copy of your application for your information.

Note: The last submitted application will be processed as your final application. If you have applied online, please do not fill out a paper application.





Glossary - Definition of words used in this booklet

Academy

An academy is a publicly funded school which operates outside of local authority control. It is funded directly by central government and does not have to follow the national curriculum. It can choose its own curriculum, as long as it is 'broad and balanced'.

Admission

Entry to school.

Admission authority

The organisation that draws up the admission arrangements and sets out the admission criteria for the schools it maintains. The local authority is the admission authority for community schools. Each voluntary, academy or free school is its own admission authority. All admission authorities within an area liaise closely to co-ordinate their admission arrangements.

Admission number

The number of places available at a school for each year group.

Admission criteria

Conditions set by the admission authority, which are used to decide whether or not a place can be offered to a child when a school receives more applications than place available.

Appeal

The independent process for questioning a decision not to offer your child a place at the school you have applied for.

(CAF) Common Application Form

The name of the local authority form used by anyone applying for a school place.

Community schools

Schools maintained only by the local authority. The local authority is responsible for admitting children to these schools.

(DfE) Department for Education

The central government department responsible for setting appropriate laws and guidance to help educate children and young people in England and Wales.

eAdmissions

The online portal where parents submit their application for a reception place – www.eadmissions.org.uk

Equal preference system

A model where all applications are treated equally in accordance with the admissions policy. Therefore, if a school receives more applications than it has places available, the admission criteria will be applied to each application with no consideration given to whether or not the school is the first, second or third preference.

Free school

Free schools are schools which are set up by groups of parents, teachers, charities, trusts, religious and voluntary groups. They are funded in the same way as academies – directly from central government.

Governing bodies

Responsible for making sure that the school is managed in line with laws and follows policies in line with the conditions set by the DfE.

Infant, junior or primary schools

Infant schools provide education for children aged four to seven, junior schools for children aged seven to 11, and primary schools for children aged four to 11.

In-year admissions

In-year admission is where a child starts school at a time other than the normal point of entry.

Local authority

The council is responsible for many services and this includes providing education across schools within the local authority's boundaries.

Voluntary aided schools

Voluntary aided schools are either Church of England or Roman Catholic schools. Each schools governing body is responsible for admitting children to their school.
